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



Figure 1. Conceptual model of how housing inequalities may be exacerbated through the recovery process.



Over 100,000 buildings were damaged.


Occupation Conditions Associated with Length of Stay (Survival) in Temporary Housing






Gender Conditions Associated with Length of Stay (Survival) in



Previous House Ownership Conditions Associated with Length of Stay (Survival) in Temporary Housing




Household Size Conditions Associated with Length of Stay (Survival) in Temporary Housing


